# DLSAU UP CLOSE

- 1 The Veterinary Medicine School Building was built in 2014 to provide for additional classrooms for the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine Program and to offer affordable, convenient, and secure living spaces to students and partners from the university.
- 2 Hotel De La Salle is a three-storey, fully-functional facility that was transformed from a veterinary clinic into a mini hotel in 2012. The structure is designed to be a laboratory hotel for the Hotel and Restaurant Management, Tourism Management, and Marketing Programs of the university.
- 3 The Forum is a fully-air -conditioned, glass-paneled multi-purpose hall that is utilized for presentation of academic dissertations and conduct of paper conferences. With an area of 150 sq. m., the venue can accommodate 120 people
- 4 Completed in 2015, the Performing Arts Hall is a 150 sq. m. state-of-the-art, multimedia hall. The 114 seats are made of fiber glass and are positioned in a sloping configuration, with surround sound system and an acoustically-enhanced interior.

- 5 The Institutional Activity Center has a total area of 1089 sq. m. and a capacity for 2000 people. A covered court, the venue boasts of two full-size basketball courts, rubber-painted floor, and sufficient lightning for night activities.
- 6 The University Swimming Pool, constructed in 1979, was renovated in 2016. It is a five-lane, short course indoor-type pool with a maximum depth of 10 feet. The pool is currently recognized as a short course pool configuration by the FINA (International Swimming Federation). FINA is the international governing body of swimming, diving, water polo, synchronized swimming and open water swimming.
- 7 The Track and Field Oval with a total area of 10,000 sq. m., includes a 300 m.-track and the smallest dimensions allowed for a soccer field. The goal posts for the soccer field are semi-permanent, which allows the space to be used for outdoor activities and programs, whereas the entire track is covered in rubber that is ideal for running and staging other athletic events.
- 8 Located beside the Track and Field Oval is the Mini-Amphitheater, an outdoor venue for musical and theatrical performances. the facility, constructed in 2016, is able to seat 1000 people.

# LASALLIAN LANGUAGE CENTER

Three centers provide about 110 classrooms and 20 group classrooms that encourage an English environment suitable to all students. ## ASSESSMENT PROCEDURE

LEVEL TEST	01	Students take their very first test (Diagnostic Test) for their levels to be assessed. This will be used in identifying their group classes and the books that they will use for their assigned classes.
ASSIGNMENT OF CLASSES	02	Students will be assigned eight classes; four one-on-one classes, two small group classes and two big group classes.
WEEKLY EXAMINATIONS	03	Students take weekly exams on writing, speaking (interview form), listening, vocabulary, etc. These determine their progress in their English language skills.
MIDTERM EXAMINATION	04	Students take midterm examinations on writing, speaking (interview form), listening, etc. However, this only applies to Semester Programs.
FINAL EXAMINATION	05	Students take final exams on writing, speaking (interview form), listening, vocabulary, etc. This is a pre-requisite for graduation.
TOEIC / TOEFL LISTENING & READING		In addition, students under the Semester Program take their TOEIC / TOEFL Listening and Reading every month.

# CLASS DESCRIPTION

## oral communication

The emphasis of this subject is on the development of skills from everyday conversation appropriate to formal speaking, as well as on the diagnosis and correction of persistent pronunciation problems, and on the correct use of stress and intonation.

## writing and composition

This subject's main purpose is to address the need to be able to write succinctly, persuasively and grammatically correct outputs from daily journal to a formal writing.

## current issues

This subject is designed to develop the students' ability to use English to critically discuss the issues of current interest as well as analyze and express their own point of view on a topic.

## skills in stage presentation

This subject is designed to build the students' confidence in communicating with people in a variety of situations. Students develop skills that enable them to have presentations on chosen topics and improve their oral communication skills.

## culture and society | effective listening

This is designed to develop linguistic skills and understanding of how others live, and their cultures and views on life. It will involve comparisons between some aspects of the way of living, traditions and customs in various cultures in Korea and the Philippines.

## multi - media english | preparation for toEIC speaking

Multi-media English is designed to enhance and develop students' own understanding of the expressions and idiomatic expressions that are commonly used in movies, advertisements in both print and broadcast, and the print media. Preparation for TOEIC Speaking is designed to make the students familiar with the TOEIC Speaking. The students are taught the different skills needed to understand and answer the questions in TOEIC Speaking through discussions and practice.

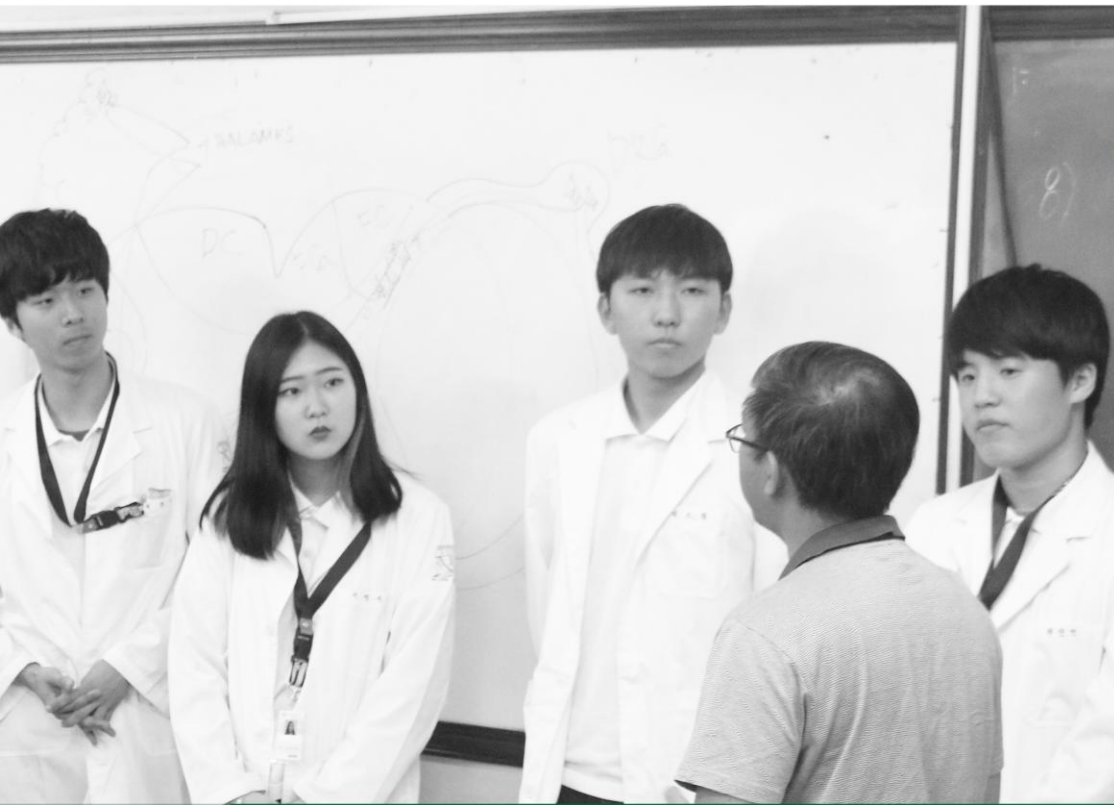
# ENGLISH ONLY POLICY

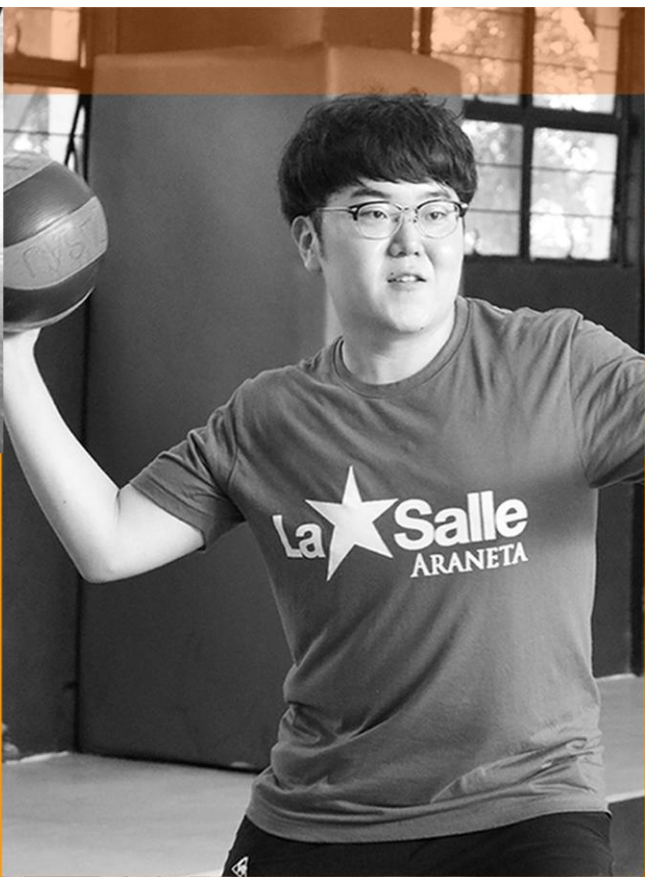

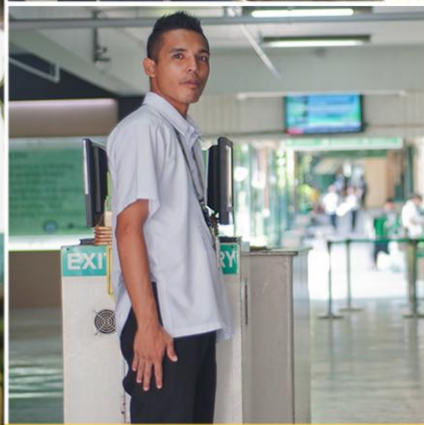

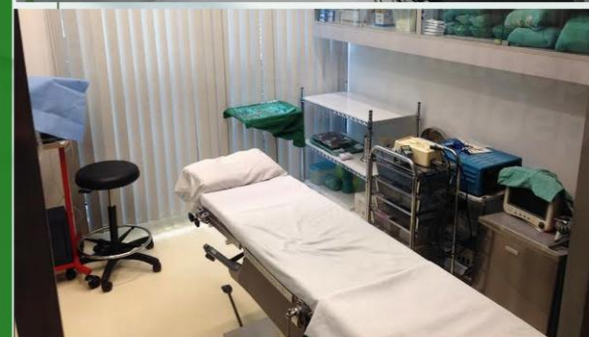


# SAFETY & SECURITY
